SEVERE DROP IN CHICAGO LINES An Unmerciful Slashing of Prices Follows Government Report

Chicago, Oct. 10.—Unmerciful slashing of prices took place today in the corn and provisions markets, largely owing to reports of more drastic government food control after November 1, but also influenced by peace talk and by weakness of securities in Wall Street. The close was flurried, both for corn and provisions, with corn 1/4c to 1/2c net lower at 1.03 1/2 to 1.03 3/4 for December and 1.08 1/2 to 1.08 3/4 for May. Oats showed a setback of 1/4c to 1/2c. Provisions finished 7/8c down.
