PANIC ON THE "L"

Two Fuses Blown Out and Passengers Are Cut and Burned.

New York, May 18.—Several persons were cut and bruised and two women faint in the panic that followed the blowing out of the fuses on two cars of the Third Avenue "L" road at the Twenty-eighth street station early today. The cars took fire and were partially burned before the crew and a few cool-headed passengers could extinguish the flames. The train was composed of a closed car, an open car and a newspaper car. The closed car was filled with a stifling smoke and the many passengers rushed for the door. Several people were crushed in the jam. Others leaped through the windows, breaking the glasses in several instances.

New Ontario Railroad.

Toronto, May 18.—Thirty-five miles of grading on the Temiscaming railway from North Bay has been completed and the laying of rails will begin June 1.

The French Shore.

Paris, May 18.—The people of Brittany are excited over rumors that the Government is about to abandon the French shore in Newfoundland to Great Britain in exchange for concessions in Gambia, Western Africa. The Breton fishermen say that they will be ruined if the Newfoundland fisheries are closed.

Vancouver an Archdiocese.

Rome, May 18.—The Diocese of Vancouver has been taken from jurisdiction of the Archdiocese of Oregon. Vancouver has been raised to an archbishopric, forming a new Canadian ecclesiastical province, having two Canadian western bishops. Right Rev. Bertram Orth, Bishop of Vancouver, has been created archbishop of the new archdiocese.

Stolen "Strad" Recovered.

Berlin, May 18.—A Stradivarius, which had been played by several czars, beginning with Alexander I., and which disappeared from the museum of the Imperial orchestra at St. Petersburg in May, 1902, has been recovered by Dwight J. Partello, the United States treasury agent here. Mr. Partello traced the stolen instrument to a collector living in a town of Southern France, who bought it for \$2,500 from a Paris dealer. The search for the violin was prosecuted in all the large cities of the world before it was recovered.
