The few pairs of pigeons brought a hundred years ago from Venice to Vienna have multiplied to such an amazing extent as to have become a public pest. There is great difficulty in exterminating these pretty creatures, as besides the danger involved to the public in shooting them, many of the birds would perhaps only be wounded. The town council have, therefore, resolved that as many as possible shall be caught alive, killed and given to poor families, and that for some years fresh eggs in equal numbers shall be abstracted from the nests. The birds, which are great favorites with the cabmen and porters, are fed as regularly as the horses, clouds of pigeons descending at the first throw of corn. WRITING BY WIRE.

Teleautography, or writing by wire, has been at last brought within range of the practical in the strictest sense by Luigi Cerebotani, an Italian Jesuit father, by whose system messages can be dispatched over a single wire instead of four, which Elisha Gray's invention requires. The message was sent over the Munich-Augsburg-Munich wire quite recently under the auspices of the Bavarian postal authorities who expressed their satisfaction with the experiments.

The principle of the new system, it is stated, lies in a mechanical arrangement whereby the motion of the transcribing pen results in two movements, always mathematically at right angles to each other. Every point in the writing area covered by the pen is thereby exhibited by the straight lines before mentioned. The apparatus is, however, so contrived that, first, the transmitting pen is light and handy, and, secondly, that while there is only one point in the writing area in which the lines intersect, the movable point or writing pencil can, by means of slides, touch the whole area. Cerebotani's invention is described as a marvel of simplicity and simply astounding in the accuracy of its working.—The Tatler.

RECEIVED AND DISPOSED OF.

Communications Dealt With by County Council.

Consideration of Bridges Will Evidently Occupy Prominent Place in Business Transacted.

At yesterday afternoon's session of the county council the following communications were read and variously disposed of:
The special committee re Beattie's bridge reported that they had opened tenders and awarded the contract for erecting superstructure to the Hamilton Bridge Company, but the company having refused to agree to complete contract for erecting the superstructure, and having refused also to consent to penalty clause for non-fulfillment of contract the committee recommended that new tenders be called for. The report was adopted.
The clerk of Norfolk county forwarded a memorial to be presented to the legislature setting forth that legislation should be passed providing that railways be compelled to place more adequate cattle guards and fences at railway crossings and other places where needed, and falling such provision by the railway that they be liable for any resulting loss or damage. Referred to petitioning committee.

County Commissioner Talbot reported as follows on the estimated cost of the proposed Caradoc bridge: Burwell road bridge, \$18,500; Muncey bridge, \$19,210; Waterloo bridge, \$17,500. These figures are for a superstructure of concrete, a superstructure of medium steel and wooden floors. The report was referred to the board of road directors.

Ratepayers of the southern part of Delaware township petitioned the proposed bridge over the Thames between Caradoc and Delaware be erected at the Burwell site and not at the Muncey site, as the latter would be of little or no benefit to any part of the township of Delaware. The petition was referred to board of road directors.

Judge Edward Elliott, London; C. C. Hodgins, Lucan, and H. D. Johnston, Stratford, arbitrators appointed to consider the appeal from the decision of the board of road directors of the change of boundaries of school sections Nos. 1, 2, 4 and 13 and the formation of the "Baroness" bridge, which was awarded and adjudged that no action be taken in the matter. The matter was referred to the finance committee.

E. B. Smith, of Alisa Craig, on behalf of Robert James Robinson, claimed \$15 for damages sustained by Mr. Robinson's horse, harness and buggy, by the former putting its foot through a hole in the county bridge over the River Aux Sable, near Alisa Craig. The animal broke both knees and will be marked for sale. Referred to board of road directors.

The Prisoners' Aid Association of Canada asked a grant toward the raising of \$1,000 to deal experimentally with the medical treatment of inebriates. Referred to finance committee.

The financial statement of North Middlesex Prison Institute showed receipts of \$490.32, expenditures of \$114.40, and a balance of \$375.92. Referred to finance committee.

Daniel Stuart Cameron, of East Williams, petitioned that his son, Robert Roy Allen Cameron, be nominated county pupil at the Ontario Agricultural College. Referred to the agricultural committee.

THE PHYSICIAN IS IMPLICATED

Jury Returns a Verdict in the Kilbourne Case.

The adjourned inquest into the death of the infant child of Emma Agnes Kilbourne took place before Coroner Piper at the police court last night. Miss Kilbourne was the first witness called. In answer to the questions put by Mr. Magee, the crown prosecutor, in regard to lifting a stove, the girl replied that on the Wednesday before going to Dr. Graham, she had attempted to lift the stove, and to move it out from the wall, for the purpose of polishing it, but was unable to move it. Mrs. Kilbourne, the next witness called, stated that her daughter did move the stove, but not very far. Mr. George Brock and Mrs. Elizabeth Russell gave evidence as to the stove's position.

Child's Death the Result of Premature Birth Caused by Alexander Graham.

Dr. MacArthur stated that he was called in on Nov. 2 by telephone to see Miss Kilbourne. Dr. Graham was at the place when she went there. Dr. Wishart did not think the patient in a dangerous condition at the time of his visit. He stated that he made no inquiry, nor did he receive any information regarding her. In fact, he did not know at the time that the patient was not a married woman. From examination, he said, no one could tell what was the cause of the miscarriage. He was afterwards asked to go back by Dr. Graham, but stated that he would not be able to go.

Dr. MacArthur stated that he was called to see Emma Kilbourne between 7 and 8 o'clock Saturday night, Nov. 2. It was a case of threatened miscarriage. Dr. Graham stated that the trouble was delayed miscarriage. He went to the house at once and found Dr. Graham nearly dead. His examination did not reveal anything with regard to the way that the miscarriage was brought about, whether by natural or improper causes. He understood that the patient had been in pain since the previous Thursday. Dr. Wishart stated that he advised that the patient be removed to the hospital, which was done about an hour later. Dr. Wishart said that there was going to be trouble in the case, and he (the witness) thought it advisable to have a third doctor present to administer chloroform, if necessary, as well as to be present as a third party, and he accordingly called Dr. Weeks, who arrived nearly two hours later. He considered three doctors might be necessary at that time to administer chloroform, as he did not know the gravity of the trouble. Witness remained in the hospital about half an hour. He saw the child next morning between 9 and 10 o'clock. The child had a scalp wound. He thought the cause of death was premature birth.

Dr. Waugh, who conducted the post-mortem, was the next witness. He stated that he examined the body on the Thursday following the Sunday the infant had died. Decomposition had taken place, but the wound on the head was evident. He would not say anything about the wound, as owing to decomposition the edges were not distinct. The cause of death was premature birth.

Witness stated that he had no conversation with Dr. Graham concerning the wound. He saw the patient on the Sunday of the birth of the child, and from her condition then he deemed it very risky for her to leave the hospital. He was again called, and being questioned in regard to the wound, stated that it was not caused by an instrument.

After nearly two hours' consideration the jury returned a verdict to the effect that "The infant child of Emma Kilbourne came to its death by its birth being caused prematurely by Dr. Alexander Graham, with the consent of the mother."

The verdict was a unanimous one. The crown attorney will now decide what steps shall be taken in the matter.

David Post, of Pine Island, was a country schoolmaster 75 years ago. At this little schoolhouse Mary Ann Wood was a pupil, and an attachment sprang up which resulted in marriage. Later he purchased a farm, and has always lived in Orange county.

The Vote on Prohibition.

During the past decade this province has twice voted on a question of prohibiting the sale of alcoholic liquor. The plebiscite of 1894 showed a majority of 80,000 in favor of prohibition, and that taken in 1898, when the question was submitted to the whole Dominion, gave a majority of 39,224 for prohibition in Ontario. The last plebiscite was 154,499, and the vote against the change 115,275. Although the majority is narrow in proportion to the vote cast, a review of the electoral ridings shows that out of a total of 89 only 18 gave majorities against prohibition. The city vote was adverse, and largely counterbalanced the rural vote. In addition to the city vote the rural constituencies having a large German or French population swelled the vote against prohibitive legislation. The three ridings voted may, the total majority being 4,251. Hamilton gave a majority of 1,632, London 836, Ottawa 698, and Kingston 412. Essex gave a majority of 2,419 against the proposed change, the Waterloos 1,366, East Bruce 317, Nipissing 288, North Perth 353, Prescott 1,454, Russell 515, Welland 449, Lincoln and Niagara 175. These, with a majority of 73 in East York, complete the list of constituencies voting against prohibition.

Turning to the constituencies in favor of prohibition, there is almost an unbroken succession of the alphabetical list from Addington to West York. No more than 21 gave prohibition majorities reaching four figures. These are: Algoma, 1,247; Bothwell, 1,109; North Bruce, 1,248; West Bruce, 1,193; Dundas, 1,305; East York, 1,390; North Grey, 1,163; North Hastings, 1,190; East Huron, 1,046; West Huron, 1,125; East Lambton, 1,576; South Leeds, 1,247; Muskoka and Parry Sound, 1,123; North Norfolk, 1,314; East Northumberland, 1,081; South Oxford, 1,297; South Perth, 1,025; Peterborough, 1,262; Prince Edward, 1,237; South Simcoe, 1,082; North Wellington, 1,037; East Wellington, 1,014; and North Westwold and Brant, 1,014. Prohibition carried in three ridings were carried by 44 of the electoral districts. Addington gave a majority of 512, South Brant 630, Brockville 538, Cornwall 523, Carleton Place 480, Stormont 467, 752, East and West Durham 753, and 909 respectively. East and West Elgin 267 and 640, South Essex 355, Frontenac, Glengarry 396, South Grenville 226, South Grey 347, Haldimand and Monck 344, Halton 322, East and West Hastings 232 and 355 respectively. South Huron 781, West Lambton 781, the Lanark North and South, 911 and 581, Leeds and Grenville 735, Lennox 641, Middlesex East 922, Middlesex West 866, South Norfolk 534, West Northumberland 671, Ontario North 822, Ontario South 773, West Ontario 388, North York 245, West Peterborough 577, South Renfrew 310, North and East Simcoe 963 and 292 respectively. North and South Victoria 703 and 617, South Westwold 889, and North York 621. The following constituencies gave prohibition majorities of less than one hundred: Kent 75, Centre 94, and West York 52. These figures show the varying balance of public opinion throughout the province, and there is no reason to believe that any material change has taken place since the vote was recorded. The value of the plebiscite was questioned when it was taken, but it is the only safe guide in determining the prospects of enforcing prohibitive legislation.
