VICTIMS OF POISON

Body of Mrs. Chapman To Be Ex-humed-Widow Cleared.

London, Oct. 29.—The home secretary, Mr. Akers-Douglas, has ordered the exhumation of the body of the late wife of George Chapman.

Cordiant, N. Y., Oct. 28.—At the close of the coroner's hearing Mrs. Maud Kiehl, the 18-year-old widow, charged with poisoning her brother-in-law, Adam Kiehl, was released for lack of evidence to connect her with the crime. It was proved that Kiehl, who was a prominent young farmer of Premie, died from strychnine poisoning.

Ten-Wheeled Locomotives.

Montreal, Oct. 28.—For the first time since the original purchase of equipment the Canadian Pacific Railway Company is going to import locomotives from across the Atlantic. The manufacturing of the United States and Canada are overcrowded with orders for next year and the inability of the company to secure delivery when required has compelled it to place an order in Scotland for twelve ten-wheeled locomotives.

William Farrell, who has been Grand Trunk yardmaster in the Barthurst street yards, Toronto, for some years, has been transferred to Montreal. His salary will, it is understood, be \$1,000 and has been compared with \$1,500 what he was paid in Toronto. His successor has not yet been appointed.

OUT OF THE RACE.

THE NORTH PERTH ELECTION VOIDED AFTER BRIEF INQUIRY

Conference Proposed by Council for Respondent.

ONLY ONE CHARGE GONE INTO

Voter for Monteth Marked Ballot of a Brown Supporter—Mr. Blake's Statement.

Stratford, Oct. 28.—The first seat in Ontario to be opened by the election court is North Perth, in which the trial judges today ordered a new election after a brief inquiry and a scrutiny of ballots. The trial was unexpectedly brief, for even some of the counsel engaged came prepared to stay at least for a week or two. There was, too, an imposing array of witnesses, to retain whom would have cost \$300 per day in witness fees. The court had barely opened, when counsel for Mr. J. C. Monteth, the Conservative member, who had been declared elected by a majority of two votes, proposed a conference with a view to settlement, and the result was an understanding, by which one charge would be taken up, which would result in the vote being declared a tie, thus necessitating a new election. This charge was speedily investigated.

LEFT VOTE A TIE.

It was shown that of two men by the name of James Fraser, both formerly living in Stratford, one had moved outside prior to the election and on polling day he, thinking he still had a vote in the city, marked the ballot he obtained for Monteth, and it was counted, while the Stratford Fraser, coming later, received a tendered ballot, marked it for Brown, and it was not counted.

This difficulty being adjusted, the vote was left a tie and after the two candidates had formally declared their ignorance of any corrupt acts in their behalf, a new election was ordered.

The trial judges were Mr. Justice Maclellan and Mr. Justice Moss, of the court of appeal. The petitioner in the case was Mr. John Brown, the unsuccessful Liberal candidate. He was represented by the eminent local counsel who have had charge of the case, Mr. J. P. Mabey, K. C., Mr. G. G. McCord, K. C., and Mr. R. T. Harding, of Stratford. The respondent was represented by Mr. S. H. Blake, K. C., and Mr. Edmund Bristol, Toronto, and Mr. E. Sydney Smith, K. C., Stratford. Mr. C. S. Grant, assistant clerk of the court of appeal, acted as registrar.
