SENATOR HANNA PASSES AWAY

Famous Politician and Financier Dead From Typhoid.

AFTER ILLNESS OF TWO WEEKS

Prominent Figure in United States Public Life and Leader in Republican Party.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 15.—Marcus A. Hanna, United States senator from Ohio, and one of the foremost figures in American life, being chairman of the National Republican commission, and recently considered a possible candidate for the presidency of the United States, died yesterday evening in his apartments at the Arlington Hotel at 6:40 p.m., of typhoid fever, after an illness of two weeks. He passed away peacefully and without pain after being unconscious since 3 a.m., at which time the first of a series of sinking spells came on, from the last of which he never rallied.

All the members of the family with one or two exceptions were at the bedside when the end came. During the last hours life was kept in his body only by the use of powerful stimulants. Death following a sinking spell that lasted ten minutes, beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Senator Hanna will be given a public funeral in the Senate Chamber at noon Wednesday, and probably lie in state at the capital. Funeral services will also be held in Cleveland Friday.

Marcus Alonzo Hanna was born in Lisbon, Columbiana County, O., Sept. 24, 1837. When he was 5 years old his father moved to Cleveland, where he organized the firm of Hanna, Garrett & Co., wholesale grocers. Subsequently he organized a large coal-mining interest, which included the mining of iron ore and of coal, the building and operation of vessels on the lakes, and the formation of the Union National Bank, of Cleveland, in 1888. In addition to these interests Hanna was for more than 15 years president of the Cleveland City Railway Company. He was interested in the manufacture of pig iron, and in the controlling interest in furnaces in Buffalo and in Western Pennsylvania. He had also other manufacturing interests in Ohio. In the course of his business career Hanna engaged in the mining of both coal and iron ore. More important still, he engaged in the transportation. It was his brain that organized the importance of the bringing together of these two raw materials at some meeting place made them economic by natural conditions. He early took an active interest in politics as a Republican. In the spring of 1886 he began the task of securing delegates to the national convention for McKinley. These efforts culminated in success. In the St. Louis convention, Hanna's management of that campaign, and of the second McKinley campaign is well known. He succeeded the late Senator Sherman in the Senate when the latter became Secretary of State, and has held a seat in that House ever since.

CHANGES NAME

Will in Future Be Known as the Canadian Improvement Co.—

Start With \$40,000,000.

New York, Feb. 15.—Announcement is made that the Consolidated Lake Superior Company will be reorganized under the name of the Canadian Improvement Company. Interests identified with the latter organization will take over the assets of the Consolidated Lake Superior. John R. Dos Passos, counsel for reorganization, is authority for the statement that the company will start business with about \$40,000,000, and that an issue of about \$15,000,000 bonds will be created. It is believed that the efforts to rehabilitate the company will be successful, as many prominent and wealthy men are identified with the movement, and are amply able to supply all the cash necessary. Mr. Dos Passos said complete harmony prevails so far as the old and new committees are concerned. "I did not attend the meeting in Philadelphia," he said, "for the reason that few details in connection with reorganization were needed, and my presence was unnecessary. The new interests have agreed to underwrite the necessary part of the issue of new securities; whatever part the stockholders do not take, the company will take. I am confident Speyer & Co. will receive a check in payment for assets in good time. When the securities of the Consolidated Lake Superior are bought they will be transferred to the Canadian Improvement Company. The new interests have adopted a financial plan which is almost identical with the plan made public in the latter part of last year. The scheme provided for the raising of \$30,000,000. Large participation in the syndicate is reported to have been taken by the Canadian Government with a view to hastening the opening of the steel plant, and the development of other industries embraced in the scope of the company's operations.
