USE OF CITY LIBRARY

SHOWS AN INCREASE

Books Taken Out in October

800 in Excess of Same

Month Last Year.

Eight hundred more books were taken out of the public library during October, 1923, than in the same month last year, according to figures made public by Librarian Crouch.

The total for the month was 29,230 as compared with 28,430 in 1922.

At the main branch of the library, 20,385 books were loaned, of which 9,896 were fiction. The east end branch loaned 3,294, including 2,101 fiction. Members took 3,042 from the south branch, 1,615 fiction, while in the southeast branch 2,509 books were loaned, of which 1,623 were fiction. The reference department was well patronized, 2,534 persons using 3,409 books. Pictures totaling 88 were also loaned.

The membership at the library at present is 23,326.

CANADIAN APPLE WINS

COVETED U. S. AWARD

The "Lobo" Originated at the

Experimental Farm in

Ottawa.

Canadian Press Despatch.

Ottawa, Nov. 14.—The silver Wilder medal, the highest award of the American Pomological Society of New York, and given only for fruits of outstanding merit, has been awarded to the experimental farm here, represented by W. T. Macoun, for the Lobo apple, one of the many very fine varieties of McIntosh red variety originated at the experimental farm, Ottawa. Mr. Macoun has just returned from a meeting of this society, which is the oldest in America and to which new fruits are submitted for awards.

The Lobo is an apple very similar to the McIntosh, but is ready for use about a month earlier, thus lengthening the season of apples of McIntosh appearance and flavor. It has proved very promising in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec.

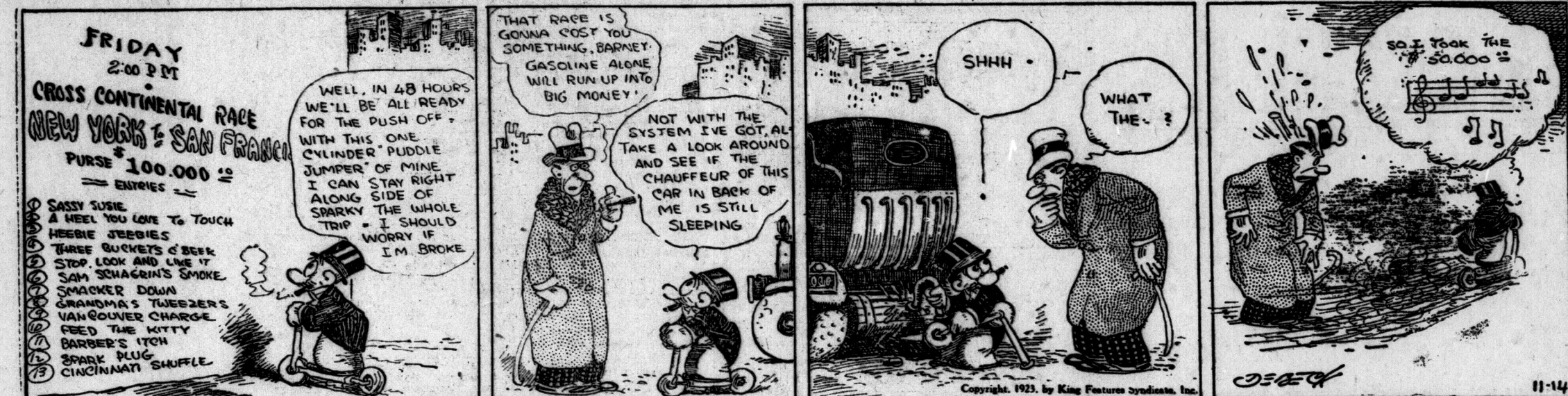
