WILL TAKE CHARGE OF WOODSTOCK

Town Manager Will Assume Control of Town Affairs at Once.

Woodstock, July 8.—R. Fraser Armstrong, C. E., of St. John, who has been appointed town manager at a salary of \$3,000, will go on duty next week. He will have complete charge of all town services and officials and act as purchasing agent. The present town officials will be retained.

The Council also ratified the actions of a committee in selling the town farm to the county for \$6,500 as a municipal home. The county is to take charge of the town farm immediately, and the deed is to be delivered upon payment by the county of the amount.

The Council contributed \$300 to a committee to buy blind instruments, the latter to be the property of the town.

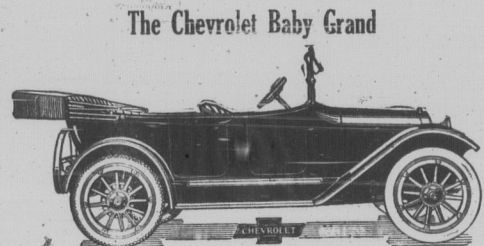

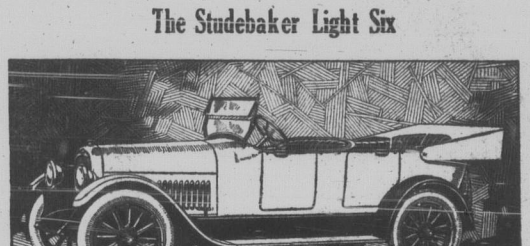

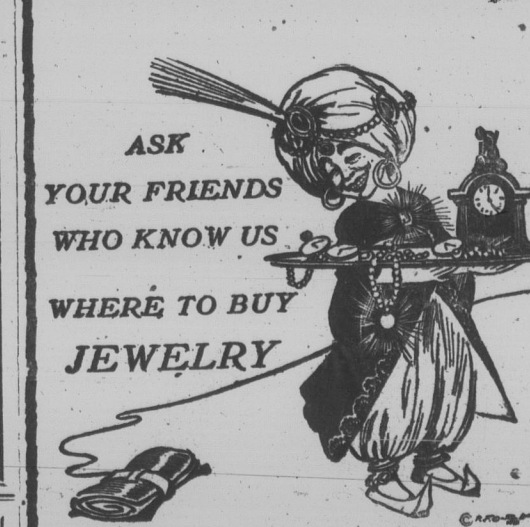
