I have been a close observer of the paving now going on in King and Adelaide-streets and it is really distressing to see the number of men who apply for work every morning, only to be met with a refusal.

Mayor Fleming may have won the applause of the wealthy by stopping needed works that will eventually have to be completed, but what of the idle workmen and their families! The civic works should have gone on, for far better were it that the wealthy should pay a few dollars more per year in taxes than that willing workmen should be compelled to stand in idleness and see their wives and little ones suffer for lack of the bare necessaries of life.

Really, however, nothing has been saved the taxpayer by the present administration, although the rate has apparently been reduced; because last year to prevent the possibility of a water famine one-half a mill on the dollar had to be included in the rate for the purpose of new pumping plant; and again, this year's administration has the street railway purches money to help the city meet its obligations; so that there has been no actual reduction in taxation at all.




