#### NOTICE IN BANKRUPTCY.

a Bankrupt.

WHEREAS under the provisions of  
the Act of the General Assembly of  
this Province, intitled "An Act relating  
to Bankruptcy in this Province," and of the  
Acts in addition to and in amendment of the  
same, Hugh Morrison, of St. James, in the  
County of Charlotte, has been de-  
clared a Bankrupt, and has accordingly

August next, all such sum and sums of money  
debts or duties, as they may owe to the said  
Bankrupt; and all persons who may have

deliver the same up to the said Assignee, on  
or before the said 10th day of August next;  
and I do require all the Creditors of the  
said Bankrupt, resident in the said Province,  
or in any other of her Majesty's North Amer-  
ican Colonies, or in the West Indies, or in  
the United States of America, within three  
months from the date hereof, to deliver in to  
the said Assignee, and to prove to his satis-  
faction, their respective claims and demands  
whether the same are actually due or to be-  
come due against the said Bankrupt: And  
notice is hereby further given, that I appoint  
a meeting of the Creditors of the said Bank-  
rupt, to be held on Tuesday the 22d day of  
June next, at noon of that day, at the Office  
of the Provisional Assignee, in St. Andrew,  
aforesaid; and a further meeting of the
