St. Antoine, P. Q. Sydney, Aug. 8.-The two giant cor porations on whose success the industrial development of Eastern Nova Scotia, in no small measure depends still face each other in battle array. After nine days of taking evidence the Steel Company today closed its case and tomorrow at 2.30 p. m., E. M. MacDonald, K. C., will open the defence on behalf of the Coal Com-

So far the case of the Steel Com pany seems to be that the Number Six coal furnished is not fit for the purpose of mgking coke. Experts have been produced some of whom stated that coal containing sulphur in excess of one per cent could not be used for coking at all, while Mr. Jones de posed that he could use coal provided it did not contain more than one and three quarters per cent of sulphur.

The whole tendency of the evidence was to discredit. Nova Scotia Coal wherever mined. The Coal people threaten retaliation, and the spectacle may be presented of each side trying to belittle the product of the other.
