

through it, give the cup of cold water in the Master's name to some of the sufferers in this land. Reports come to us from time to time of invalids brought in, some of them from a great distance, who after a short stay in the Hospital, and with God's blessing on the care and attention bestowed, return to their homes to make known to their friends what great things God has done for them. The Hospital is managed by a medical christian man ; the nurse is a christian woman, an Indian who reads and prays with the patients in their own tongue. The clergyman of the parish visits it regularly, and the poor sufferers are pointed to the Lamb of God as the one who alone can comfort them. Mrs. Rolston has a large class of the women to whom she imparts instructions in various domestic matters. I need not say that any help in the way of groceries or clothing for patients will be most welcome ; indeed material to be used in the sewing classes would also be very useful. Anything in the way of medicine or strengthening food of any kind would be a blessing to the Hospital. We find food and good care with God's help go a long way in restoring many of these people. Nice pictures, suitable for the walls ; pieces of carpet for the floor, anything to make the room look a little more bright would, as you will see, help much. I must ask you on behalf of the committee, on behalf of these poor Indians, and on behalf of a large circle of out patients, to thank the Quebec Branch of the W.A. most heartily for their kind christian help in this great work. We shall have to look to such friends for much practical sympathy if this work is to be maintained. Our Indian Mission Funds are far behind, and the Hospital can not be pushed ahead of the Indian work, and for this very reason, if the women of Canada do not give it a place close to their hearts, I do not see how it is to be carried on ; but I believe it has that place, evidence of it comes to me from time to time, and for this and other tokens of God's approval we thank Him and take courage.
