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

This will be delicious for flavouring custards, molasses cake and anything else where lemon extract is used. It retains the strength of the lemon while cooking and is much more delicate to the taste than the oil or extract of lemon.

HOW TO TEST BUTTER.—A man employed in a restaurant says:—"Any house-keeper can prove the honesty of her grocer or her butter by melting it. Pure butter melted produces a pure, limped, golden oil, and it retains the butter flavour. Melt oleomargarine, and the oil smells like tallow, and looks like tallow, and a scum rises on the surface. Butterine is a mixture of dairy butter and fats. Melt that and the butter oil will rise to the top. Pour this oil, and you will find the fats at the bottom, whitish in colour, and giving off a disagreeable smell."

TEA-LEAVES FOR VARNISHED PAINTS.—Save the spent tea-leaves for a few days, then steep them in a tin pail or pan for half an hour; strain through a sieve, and use the tea for all varnished paints. It requires very little elbow polish, as the tea acts as a strong detergent, cleansing the paint from all impurities, and making it equal to new. It cleans windows and sashes and oil-cloths; indeed, any varnished surface is improved by its application. It washes window-panes and mirrors much better than water, and is excellent for cleaning walnut and looking-glass frames. It will not do to wash unvarnished paints with.

PRIZE CORN BREAD.—Mix with two quarts of fresh ground corn meal, three pints warm water, one tablespoonful sugar, one teaspoonful salt, and a large tablespoonful of hop or brewer's yeast. Set in a warm place about five hours, until it rises well; then add about three quarters of a pint of wheat flour and half a pint of warm water, and let it stand to rise again, about an hour and a half. Pour into a pan well greased with butter. Let it stand to rise a few minutes, and bake in a moderately hot oven nearly an hour and half. It is good hot or cold. Corn-bread made essentially after this recipe carries off the prize among a hundred exhibitors, on the score of quality and economy.
