Continued from Page One. From this immemorial the Augustinian Sisters have had no other dwelling and no other mother house than the hospital.

It will be a happy day for France, which will see the re-establishment of the Sisters in the hospitals.

The Augustinians founded in the seventh century had had twelve hundred years of service when they were expelled from the hospitals of Paris.

At the Hospital de la Charite twenty Sisters cost 4,000 francs a year; forty-four lay nurses cost 66,000 francs.

The suppression of "maigre" diet and the increase in wine allowance to nurses burdens the budget of the Assistance Publique by 217,000 francs a year.

Here the words in which President Carnot addressed one of these Sisters in planning to her dress the ribbon of the Legion d'Honneur: "I decorate you for your zeal and for the service which you have rendered to the sick; do not let your modesty be offended by this decoration; in your person I decorate the whole Order."
