which will see the re-establishment of the Sisters in the hospitals, of the Sisters whose rule says, "They the Sisters whose rule says. shall only have for convents the sick room; for cell a rented room; for chapel their parish church; for cloister the streets of the town and the words of the hospital; for enclosure but obedience; for veil but modesty." Such is the definition of the Sisters of Charity given by St. Vincent de Paul, quoted and admired by Victor Hugo, and which is to be found in an article full of information upon the subject, where the author himself porrows most eloquent figures from the book of Mr. Bournand.

The Augustinians founded in the seventh century laid had twelve hundred years of service when they were expelled from the hospitals of Paris. and they did not possess a single house to receive their members.

At the Hopital de la Charite twenty Sisters cost 4,000 francs a yearforty-four lay ourses cost 66,000 francs. At Ivry the laicisation cost 300,000 francs to begin with and 40,000 francs a year. At Cochin it cost 138,000 francs and each year an additional 18,000 francs to the expenditure.


