Ukraine

Bilateral trade with Ukraine was \$218 million in 2004. Total Canadian exports to Ukraine were \$57 million in 2004, up 83 percent since 2002. Exports from January to July of this year are up an additional 23 percent. Canada's primary exports to Ukraine include agricultural machinery, vehicles, textiles, pharmaceuticals and seafood.

Minister Peterson's visit to Ukraine will be the first of a Canadian minister since the Orange Revolution in 2004 led to a new reformist government under Viktor Yushchenko. Canada sent approximately 1,000 election observers to oversee the Ukrainian presidential elections in 2004. A strong sense of goodwill ties Canada and Ukraine. More than one million Canadians have family roots in Ukraine.
