

THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF CANADA.

BILL 64.

An Act to amend The Feeding Stuffs Act, 1937.

1937, c. 30.

HIS Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. Section three of *The Feeding Stuffs Act, 1937*, chapter thirty of the statutes of 1937, is repealed and the following substituted therefor: 5

Exemptions.

“3. (1) Subject to subsection two of this section, this Act shall not apply to

- (a) whole hays, straws, corn stover and silage when unmixed with any other material; 10
- (b) hulled oats, hulled barley, cracked Indian corn and the whole seeds or grains of cultivated farm crops;
- (c) feeding stuff prepared in accordance with a prescription provided and signed by the purchaser for consumption or processing by such purchaser; 15
- (d) feeding stuff for export from Canada and so labelled;
- (e) feeding stuffs sold by the individual grower thereof.

Subject to regulation.

(2) Such hulled oats, hulled barley, cracked Indian corn and the whole seeds or grains of cultivated farm crops as are intended for consumption by live stock shall be deemed to be feeding stuff and subject to the regulatory powers provided by section fourteen of this Act.” 20

2. Section fourteen of the said Act is amended by adding immediately after paragraph (d) thereof the following paragraph: 25

Regulations.

“(dd) prescribing and limiting the vitamin claims that may be made for any feeding stuff or any ingredients or constituents thereof;”
