Dissolution of Parliament

Mr. Tucker: What right had the Prime Minister to speak?

Mr. Pearson: By what right did the Prime Minister speak?

Mr. Tucker: The order in council was signed before he spoke.

Mr. Speaker: Right or wrong, that is the view I take. Before leaving the chair, may I just say one word on my own behalf—

Mr. Sinclair: Shame. You were a good Speaker.

Mr. Speaker: —that I do so with regret because of the co-operation I have received from all members of the house on all sides.

At 6.13 p.m. Mr. Speaker left the chair.

The twenty-third parliament was dissolved on Saturday, February 1, 1958, by proclamation of His Excellency the Governor General.
