

restaurant which receives in addition a substantial revenue from the operation of its business, the commissioners of internal economy would find it easier to control the spending of the house's estimates if they were supplied with monthly statements showing the receipts and expenditures of the restaurant;

(b) That the restaurant's accounts should be audited by one of the Auditor General's subauditors because, although its revenues

are not credited to the consolidated revenue fund, the employees' salaries and the deficit on the yearly operations are charged upon the above \$15,000 vote which is under the control of the commissioners of internal economy;

(c) That the joint committee on the restaurant agrees to co-operate in this effort to ensure a close audit of all the moneys voted for the expenditures of the House of Commons.
