Mr. Young (Beaches—Woodbine): Mr. Speaker, I want to express my appreciation as well to the Government House Leader for clarifying the length of time that we have to make some remarks on my Private Member's Motion.

This is one of several times that I have presented exactly the same Bill for debate in the House. I think an equal number of times the Minister of the Environment (Mr. Bouchard), and previous Ministers of the Environment have subsequently assured the House and the Canadian public that it is the intention of the Government to bring in legislation to do exactly the same as what this Bill will do.

I have been here for nearly ten years and I have heard these same assurances from the same Ministers. I am still waiting for the legislation. Hopefully, I will have the support of Members on all sides of the House tonight not to talk this Bill out, but to ensure that it is referred to an appropriate legislative committee so that all Members on can have input into the legislation and certainly the Canadian public can also have input.

Over the last couple years it has become politically popular for politicians to talk about the environment. It is as if suddenly many politicians have discovered that
