

**23.** The debate upon the Address may be continued from day to day; and in the event of an amendment being moved the Speaker says: "Honourable Senators. It is in amendment moved by....., seconded by....., That (reading the motion)." The question is then put on the amendment.—"Is it your pleasure, &c." "Contents or Non-Contents have it," as the case may be. The Address in reply being adopted, the Speaker says: "Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council."
