### COMPANY IS WOUND UP

Vineland Canning Company Liquidated by Order of Court.

Mary Greisman, a minor, who was severely injured in the Queenston car crash on July 7, obtained judgment on October 7, 1914, for \$425 for medical nursing and other expenses.

An objection was made that the children's hours of play should be taken up by the mother, but his lordship retorted that they wouldn't bother about that for a couple of weeks.

Mr. Justice Riddell has granted an injunction in favor of the plaintiff restraining the defendant until the 18th from selling or in any way disposing of the shares.

### RED CROSS HELPS TRAFALGAR DAY

Canadian Branch Will Clear Way for Big Collection Soon.

### ANNUAL MEETING HELD

Toronto Branch Took in Over Hundred Thousand Dollars in Year.

Reports of the work done by the Toronto branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society were presented at the annual meeting yesterday, held in the city hall.

Cash receipts of the Toronto branch for the fiscal year were \$166,977, and \$75,290 pieces of goods were received, having a value of \$18,580. The expenses amounted to \$1,546.80 and \$2,726.55 was spent on materials, leaving a total of \$162,166.59 which was handed over to the Canadian Red Cross Society.

At present the society has 876 life members, paying a fee of \$25.00, and 1533 annual members paying \$2.00, but the number of members is no indication of the number of subscribers as many firms subscribe where no membership certificate is given.

Announcement was made of the fact that the entire proceeds of the bicycle race being held at Exhibition park on Monday afternoon by the Dunlop and Rubber Company are to be given to the society.

### PATRIOTIC FUND URGES PAYMENTS

Statement Up to End of September Shows How Matters Stand.

### FUTURE INSTALMENTS

Appeal is Made That These Be Paid Before They Are Due.

The council of the Toronto and York County Patriotic Fund Association beg to report the following matters for the consideration of the subscribers:

The total subscriptions amount to \$1,007,088.55, to which is to be added interest earned by the fund \$6,820.28, making together \$1,013,908.83.

The total cash received on account of subscriptions and miscast up to September 30, 1915, amounts to \$452,128.82.

The total disbursements for all purposes up to the same date amount to \$456,976.19, leaving cash on hand on September 30, 1915, \$165,148.14.

The total amount still owing on subscriptions is \$560,710.63. Of this sum \$24,406.55 is overdue and unpaid, some portions thereof being owing since the commencement of the fund.

Deducting this sum of \$24,406.55 from the total unpaid sum of \$560,710.63, there remains the sum of \$536,304.08 still owing to the association by subscribers, one-half thereof being due on March 1, 1916, and the other half on September 1, 1916.

With the increase in recruiting there has been a corresponding increase in the number of dependents entitled to relief from the fund, and the relief disbursements for the month of September just passed amounted to the sum of \$78,222.27.

No doubt there will be a substantial addition to the number of dependents on the fund during each succeeding month of the war, which will involve a substantial increase in the monthly disbursements for relief. Thus it will appear that the above mentioned cash balance of \$165,148.14 will be exhausted by relief disbursements for the months of October and November. Under the circumstances the council of the association has decided to appeal to subscribers, not to avail themselves of the time to which they are entitled under the terms of their subscription for payment of future instalments, but to pay the same at an earlier date, and it respectfully urges them to pay on November 1, 1915, the instalment due March 1, 1916, and to pay January 1, 1916, the instalment due on September 1, 1916.
