

## MUNRO AND IRWIN IN GREAT BATTLE

Tied for Senior Honors at  
University Schools'  
Field Day.

The eighth annual field day of the University Schools was held at Varsity Stadium yesterday afternoon, and the best meet since the war started was the result. All events were keenly contested by the schools, and a fine time was had about for the senior championship. After counting up, it was found that these two boys were tied, with 22 points each. Kearns won three honors, and was named the champion. He won the honors by scoring 23 points. J. Rogerson gave him a hard battle, and finished second, with 20 points. G.
