MILLIONS FOR WARSHIPS. Argentine Republic Prepares to Spend \$32,500,000 in That Way.

Buenos Ayres, Sept. 21.—According to the Naevon, the government proposes to expend \$32,500,000 of the \$32,500,000 which it has asked for in purchasing three large iron-clad, nine torpedo-boat destroyers and 21 torpedo boats. The remaining \$5,000,000, in addition to \$2,000,000 voted last year, will be spent for mines, floating batteries, river gunboats and transports.

ENGINEER LOSES HIS LIFE

Long Freight Train Unable to Make Siding and Express Strikes It.

Napanee, Sept. 21.—In a collision between the No. 5 eastbound express from Toronto, and a westbound freight at 2 o'clock this morning, Engineer Wm. T. Blain of Montreal was killed and his fireman only escaped death by jumping from the engine before the crash came.

Edward Milroy, fireman of the passenger engine, says that when he and his unfortunate mate saw the headlight of the freight engine, he thought it was the clear white semaphore.

When he got near enough, said Milroy, "Frank said, 'My God, it's the freight and on the wrong track,' and he got the air brakes.

The last word he said to me was 'Jump,' and I did jump. I thought Frank was going to follow me, but he didn't.

When he saw that a collision was imminent, Engineer Orill of the freight train called to his fireman to jump, and set the example by jumping to safety himself.

The rear end of the express car No. 2 was smashed for a distance of four feet, and Messenger Bowet was hurled along the car and buried in a mass of packages. He escaped serious injury. The end of the second-class coach was also wrecked, but no passengers were hurt.

Passengers in the smoker were badly shaken up, but all left at 7 o'clock this morning for the east.

All that saved a terrible loss of life was the fact that two of these empty cattle cars were next to the freight engine, and they all flew into kindling wood, and in that way broke the jar from No. 2.

Engineer Charles Orill and Fireman David Young, both of Belleville, and on the freight engine, were painfully hurt in legs and arms, by jumping from their engine. Brakeman James Miller of Montreal was thrown from the door as the crash came. His head was badly cut.

Passengers' Escape. One peculiarity of the collision was that the passengers in the first five sleepers scarcely felt the jolt; but some of them in the two rear cars were thrown off their berths, but none seriously injured.

I. F. Hellmuth, K.C., of Toronto, was the attorney for Mr. Hellmuth, who will be remembered, avoided the wreck at Salisbury, Eng., by waiting over one train.

WRECK ON THE GREAT NORTHERN. St. Paul, Minn., Sept. 21.—In a rear-end freight collision at Cut Bank, Mont., late last night, two stockmen, whose names have not been reported, were killed. The engineer, Dinton and Brakeman Critchell were killed.

The caboose and two freight cars of the first train were wrecked and caught fire.

TWO KILLED. Pulaaski, Wis., Sept. 21.—A work train on the new line of the Northwestern road ran into a workmen's sleeping car last night, killing two and injuring fourteen other laborers.
