## BRITISH SUCCESSES IN AFRICA REPORTED BY LORD NO

TWENTY-SECOND YEAR

Sir Henry Rawlinson's Column Rushed a Laager and Inflicted Severe Defeat-Plumer Captured Men and Supplies-Pilcher's Operations in Orange River Colony.

LONDON, April 15 .- The War Office has received the following lespatch from Lord Kitchener, dated Pretoria, April 15:

"Col. Sir Henry Rawlinson's column rushed the south laager, northwest of Klerksdorp, at daylight. Six Boers were killed, ten wounded and twenty-three taken prisoners. He captured a twelve-pounder, one pom-pom complete and two ammunition wagons with ammunition. "Our casualties were three wounded.

"Col. Plumer captured a field cornet and seven men, with ten . wagons and eighteen rifles.

"During Col. Pilcher's operations in Orange River Colony seven Boers were killed."
