TORONTO, April 26-Premier Drury today introduced in the Legislature the Ontario civil servants' superannuation act. It inaugurates a superannuation for civil servants both outside and in, with the exception of crown-attorney and registrars. The act becomes effective on June 15 of this year

Estimated Cost.

For the superannuation of the 110 now over 70 years of age the cost would be \$12,000 a year. The widow of a superannuated civil servant is to get half for life, and the services, or subsequently, he must be insured for an amount not less than \$5,000 for a period of at least ten years from the entry into the service, and in from the entry into the service, and in case of his default of producing certi-

case of his default of producing certificates of such insurance, the superannuation board may insure and take the cost from his salary.

Cost of Administration.

The amount paid is graded by the ages 21 to 45. The latter pays in 5 per cent and the former 2%. The cost of administration will be borne by the province. The allowance to any employee upon rettring shall be calculated upon the average year's salary during upon the average year's salary during the last three years, and shall not exceed one-fiftieth part of such annual salary multiplied by the total number of years' service, not more than 30 years to be reckoned and the yearly superannuation not to exceed \$2,000. A servant who has served 30 years continuously may retire at 65. An employee who has not served ten years and retires at 70 shall be paid out of the consolidated revenue fund the expension and retire of his constant of the consolidated revenue fund the expension are acceptable of his an amount equal to one-tenth of his salary multiplied by the number of

salary multiplied by the number of years of service.

The fund will be administered by a board composed as follows: the provincial treasurer, the civil service commissioner, one representative to be appointed by each of the recognized political parties in the Legislature, and a representative of the Ontario Civil Service Commission

TELLS QUANTITY OF **POWER EXPORTED BY** FIRMS IN CANADA

Foster Replies To Question in House of Commons.

OTTAWA, April 26.—(By Canadian Press.)—A lengthy question dealing with the names of the officers and directors of three companies stationed in Sir Henry Drayton's report on the export of electricity from Canada, laid on the table of the House on June 2, 1919, was answered by Sir George Foster in the Commons this afternoon. The question came from C. A. Fournier (Bellechasse), who asked how much power was being exported at the present time by each of the three companies. It was shown that the three companies are the Ontario Power Company of Niagara Falls, Ont., Canadian Niagara Power Company, and the Electrical Development Company of Ontario, Limited. Sir Adam Beck is the president of the first-named concern; A. Munro Grier of the second. and Sir Henry M. Pellatt of the last-named company. The average export for the month of February, 1920, was as follows: directors of three companies stationed as follows:
Ontario Power Company (Hydro-Electric Power Commission), 42.687 kilowatts; Canadian Niagara Power Company, 15.675 kilowatts; Electrical Development Company, 11,845, kilo-

watts.

The maximum export since March 31, 1916, for the respective companies is as follows: Ontario Power Company (Hydro-Electric Power Commission), 55,680 kilowatts; Canadian Niagara Power Company, 52,910 kilowatts; Electrical Development Company, 22,240 kilowatts,

Each company had been given a license to export power after undertaking to fill the requirements of its Canadian customers. In each case, the agreement had been faithfully carried out
