TO RETIRE ALL CIVIL SERVANTS 70 YEARS OLD

Drury Introduces Superannuation Bill, Effective June 15.

GOVERNMENT PAYS HALF Employees Over 65 Years of Age May Retire If Desired.

TORONTO, April 26.—Premier Drury today introduced in the Legislature the Ontario civil servants' superannuation act. It is a guarantee of a superannuation for civil servants both outside and in, with the exception of crown-attorneys and registrars. The act becomes effective on June 15 of this year.

One hundred and ten civil servants will be superannuated this year by the clause, which makes compulsory retirement at the age of 70. The Government pays half the cost of the superannuation, and the Government pays half of their own superannuation and the Government pays half of their own superannuation.

The actual amount paid in by the civil servant is from 2 1/2 per cent to 5 per cent of his salary. The pensioner, at least, does not get what he paid in, at least there is a clause that "strong should carry the weak."

Estimated Cost.

The premier said that the estimated cost to the government would be \$75,000 yearly, with the contribution from Alice's salaries.

The widow of a superannuated civil servant is to get half for life, and the children up to the age of 18 years. If an employee is married when he enters the service, or subsequently, he must be insured for not less than \$5,000 for a period of at least ten years from the entry into the service, and in case of his death, the surviving dependents of such insurance, the superannuation board may insure and take the cost from his salary.

Cost of Administration.

The amount paid is graded by the age of the employee. The latter pays 1 per cent and the former 2 1/2. The cost of administration is to be borne by the province. The allowance to any employee upon retiring shall be calculated on the basis of his salary during the last three years, and shall not exceed one-fifth part of such annual salary multiplied by the number of years of service, not more than 30 years to be reckoned and the yearly superannuation amount not less than \$2,000.

A servant who has served 30 years continuously may retire at 65. An employee who has not served 30 years and retires at 70 shall be paid out of the consolidated revenue fund an amount equal to one-tenth of his salary multiplied by the number of years of service.

TELLS QUANTITY OF POWER EXPORTED BY FIRMS IN CANADA

Foster Replies To Question in House of Commons.

OTTAWA, April 26.—(By Canadian Press).—A lengthy question dealing with the names of the officers and directors of three companies stationed in Sir Henry Drury's report on the export of electricity from Canada, was asked on the table of the House on June 2, 1919, was answered by Sir George Foster in the Commons this afternoon.

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FINED \$100 FOR FALSE STATEMENTS IN "AD"

Goods Advertised as Greatly Reduced in Price Only "Shoddy."

Business was just beginning to boom when the retail merchants committee of the board of trade investigated and laid the information on which the charge was based.

AMUNDSEN TO DROP EXPEDITION TO POLE

WASHINGTON, April 26.—Radio messages received today by the navy department from its station at Cordova, Alaska, indicate that Roald Amundsen, the Arctic explorer, intends to abandon his effort to reach the North Pole.

The messages said it was understood that Amundsen, who arrived last week at Anadyr, Siberia, intended to take the steamer Victoria at Nome for Seattle. It was stated that the time of his departure would depend on the time of his getting clear of ice in Siberia.

WESTERN MEMBERS OBJECT TO MONSTER MILITARY EXPENSES

OTTAWA, April 26.—(By Canadian Press).—Western members of the Commons were to have held a caucus this morning, but owing to various circumstances, it will be held later in the week.

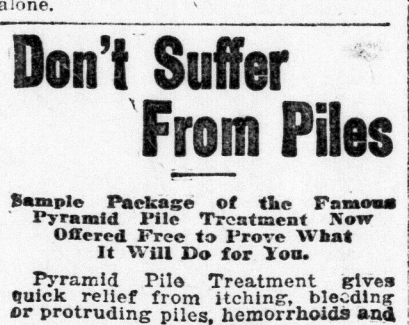
One section is intending to express strong views on the proposal to spend twelve and a half millions of dollars on military affairs. One member today declared that the boy scout movement was doing much better and more effective work than the cadet movement.

It is also pointed out that the total of \$12,500,000 does not include the cost of the proposed air force, which is thought to be at least in the neighborhood of another two millions. Members point out that in 1913 the expenditure for the permanent force was \$280,000, whereas it is now proposed to spend six and a half millions on this alone.
