BREAD PRICES UP

Windsor City Council Orders An Investigation Into the Cause.

WINDSOR, May 25,-Declaring the entire housing scheme of the Provincial Government, by which loans are given through the guaranteeing of bonds by municipalities, to be based on unbusi-nesslike methods in that operations were conducted on a certain basis with no profits to offset possible losses, Ald. George Urquhart at tonight's meeting of the Windsor City Council asked for a detailed, signed statement by the Windsor Housing Commission to be published in all newspapers with a local circulation, completely outlining the particulars of the plan. His request was grainted by a resolution of the council. Ald Urquhart wanted an entire statement as to the method of sale of depentures, what they

would sell for, what interest would be involved, etc.

Investigation of the operations Investigation of the operations of Windsor bakeries was ordered by the city council tonight as a result of the further increase of 1 cent a loaf on the staff of life, which went into effect today, and of the report from the Dominion Board of Commerce which indicated that bread was selling in Toronto at 13 cents a loaf, and in smaller Ontario centres at 11 and 12 cents a loaf.
