

C.A.A.L. CHAMPIONSHIP MEET WORTHINGTON WON MEDAL

West End Y.M.C.A. Captured the Penman Shield—Central Y.M.C.A. Took the Five Mile Race.

The newly formed athletic body, the Canadian Association Athletic League, which has been brought into being by the united efforts of all the Y.M.C.A.s of Canada, held their first annual championship meet, Saturday afternoon on the city well kept Varsity field. Ordinarily it takes a considerable length of time—perhaps two or three days—to hold a championship meet in Toronto in years has proved so completely successful as that of Saturday. The weather, too, chitly, owing to the wind, was just cool enough to give the competitors zeal to work all the harder. The attendance was large; the grand stand was well filled with a sprinkling of ladies and many gentlemen. The games were well organized; the officials did their best in time; the rule was adopted that any entry not present to compete when the heats were called should be scratched. This was a Saturday regulation and it worked wonders in getting things going on time. As a result there were no waits. The management committee deserve the utmost praise for the efficiency and precision with which they worked their long list of over 150. Everything was over by six.

The entry list was certainly a remarkable and breaking record; it included the best men in Canada. There were men present from the Montreal Athletic Association, and from various Y.M.C.A.s. Throughout the running of the meet, the track was hardly wide enough to accommodate all the competitors in each race.

A popular move was the addition of two running events for the boys. The 100 yards boys' race was well contested. B. Henderson of the West End Y.M.C.A. came first in the second and final heats, winning the medal. The three mile walk brought out some great steeplechasers. It was funny to notice the acrobatic and the steeplechaser. Some stepped high, some stepped low, some stepped fast and some stepped slow.

Several factors contributed to the success of the games: one was that only Canadian amateurs were eligible to enter. No Americans were allowed to come in and take the chief events. Another leading factor was that the entry list was opened to all Canadian amateurs, and was not restricted to members of the Y.M.C.A. in Canada. The five mile team race for the Dunlop Trophy was an important part of the program. Four teams were entered, namely: Y.M.C.A., Montreal; Stratford Harrier Club; Central Y.M.C.A.; and West End Y.M.C.A., Toronto. The teams were started on the lawn at the north end of the field, and ran across the gate across a short field and over the fence to the northwest corner of Queen's Park; then south past the Parliament buildings and around the south end, up the east side and then went west over the fence and into the athletic field by the same gate they went out, to the west side of the track, out northeast gate to Bloor street to Avenue Road, up Avenue Road to Dupont, along Dupont street to Bathurst, down Bathurst to Bloor, Devonshire place in northwest gate, around the track with the pole on the right, and finished in front of the grand stand. It was a good move to have the teams re-enter the grounds when the race was about half over. This gave the spectators some idea of how the race was progressing.

The Penman Shield championship trophy—to be held for one year by the Young Men's Christian Association making the highest number of points in the five-mile race (not including the five-mile race), was won by the West End Y.M.C.A. team. The Spaulding gold medal—to be given to the individual making the highest number of points during the day, was won by W. R. Worthington of the West End Y.M.C.A., Toronto.

Dunlop trophy for five-mile team race—Open to all amateur clubs in Canada. 6 men to constitute a team. 4 men of any team making highest number of points to hold trophy for one year, also to receive silver medal.
