IN AN ISSUE IN ELECTIONS WOULD HAVE LOST 20 SEATS

Baptists Denounce Separate School
Proposals—Find Them Hard
to Believe.

In no measured terms a mass meeting of the Baptists of the city expressing their condemnation of Sir Wilfrid Laurier's action with regard to the Northwest separate school question. After addresses by prominent Baptists, a standing vote was taken and the meeting rose as one in support of the following resolutions:

"Whereas the British North America Act, as to provinces other than Ontario and Quebec, provides that each province may exclusively make laws in relation to education, subject to the right of the Dominion Parliament when appealed to in a specific case to enact remedial legislation, and the Imperial Parliament to establish new provinces, and to define the constitution thereof, but prohibits such Parliament from ever afterwards altering such constitution.

And whereas the bill establishing the new Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan proposes to make the maintenance of a separate school system a permanent constitutional obligation of these provinces, thus depriving them of their full provincial rights and fettering their whole future educational development.

And whereas the introduction at any time of such a question into federal politics is calculated to awaken ill feeling on a subject in regard to which the Canadian people are peculiarly sensitive, and more especially in view of the fact that no intimation was given to the electorate prior to or during the recent general elections, that it is hereby resolved in connection with the granting of autonomy to the territories to impose any such fetters.

"Therefore this meeting of Baptist citizens respectfully protests against the proposed legislation, and expresses the hope that the government may so modify its bill as to leave the determination of their future educational policy to the free action of the new provinces."

If they'd Only Known.
Mayor Usher was in the chair, and the schoolhouse of Bloomsbury Baptist Church was filled with representative Baptists. The mayor said that it was wrong to hamper the new provinces with anything of the sort. It was contrary to the principle of confederation. He hoped that the government would not persist in such action.

D. E. Thomson moved the resolutions. Why had the electors not been told of this before the elections? he asked. Was it not a great question that the G.T.P. had? He would have asked against it, and there were tens of thousands in the province who would have come out and reduced the government's majority by twenty if they had known of such a proposal. The people would have been unable to believe that the great Liberal party would do such a thing, a thing that it had never done before, to interfere with provincial rights. Sir Wilfrid had seemed to have an opportunity to get at the staunch yeomanry of Ontario. He would have done them from now.

Obstacle to Progress.
Prof. Tracy seconded the resolutions in an address condemning any such action which, he said, was entirely in opposition to the British principle of "governing people by letting them govern themselves." It was hard to believe that Laurier, who had been the idol of his people, would allow his name to go down as having put an obstacle in the way of Canadian prosperity.

There were other speeches, and it was decided that copies of the resolution should be sent to the premier, the Toronto members, and to the members of the cabinet.

Master Harrowsmakers Convene.
The Master Harrowsmakers Convention held the annual convention of their association at the Rossin House, 101 St. George Street, last night. Mr. Nix of Exeter arrived last night, and about 100 delegates from all over the province were present. The usual trade matters were discussed, and the election of officers took place. The convention closed with a banquet at the Rossin House.

BURLINGTON TO DANVILLE RAILROAD WILL BE EXTENDED

Hamilton Cataract Power Company Hold Annual Meeting and Discuss the Outlook.

Hamilton, March 6.—(Special.)—The receipts from the three performances given by the Magpie Minstrels last Tuesday and Wednesday amounted to over \$1700. The expenses were \$888, so that there is a surplus of \$1767. This was the statement presented to the Hamilton Chapter of the Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire.
