Col. Currie Refers to Expenditures and Charges Over-lapping.

## TO CENSURE MINISTER

Judge Mackenzie Moves an Amendment—Wants Ammunition Sale Investigated

(Continued From Page 1).

publications which it was expecting the people to exercise in conduct of their private affairs.

Upon motion of Sir Robert Borden, the debate was adjourned until next Tuesday.

Upon motion to go into supply Judge Mackenzie (North Cape Breton and Victoria) moved in amendment a motion censuring the minister of militia for selling 3,000,000 rounds of ammunition since the opening of the war to Col. J. Wesley Allison without the sanction of an order in council, and called upon the government to have the entire supply investigated by the Meredith-Duff commission.

Mr. Mackenzie said that the militia department had contracted to sell 3,000,000 rounds of cartridges, but only 3,000,000 had been delivered. The price was \$20 per thousand, although they had cost the country \$24 per thousand. He read a letter from the department minister of militia to the quarter-master-general, written in the fall of 1914, advising against the sale of any ammunition during the war. Mr. Mackenzie personally doubted if any ammunition should have been sold in war time in view of the possibility of an invasion. At any rate no such sales should have been made except by order-in-council.

In the fall of 1915, according to letters read from the return table in the house, a correspondence began between J. Wesley Allison and the militia department, which resulted in the contract of sale. The first cartridges were shipped via the Corbinian to McVickers House, Broadway, London. Other shipments followed, until 3,000,000 were delivered. Then the auditor-general called for a copy of the order-in-council authorizing the sale. An order-in-council had been prepared, but either it had not been signed, or his royal highness, or if it had, his royal highness had declined to sign it.

It was up to the minister of finance in Mr. Mackenzie's opinion to produce the order in council if it had ever been approved and if it had not been approved it was up to the prime minister to deal with the minister of militia and defense in acting illegally in making the sale. No one knew where the cartridges had gone to, but it was reported that they had been resold at a profit to the imperial government by Col. J. Wesley Allison. The minister of militia and defense, the existence, and it was indeed true, seemed to be in the hands of Mr. Allison. Mr. Mackenzie wanted the whole matter investigated by the Meredith-Duff commission.

land. By the time he returned the transaction had been assailed in the house and in the press of the country, an investigation having been authorized. The order-in-council was held by pending the result of the investigation.

Sir Wilfrid said that the government could not evade its responsibility. If the transaction was all right they should go ahead and get the order-in-council signed. If it was all wrong, they should disavow it. He said that the charges ought to go to the Meredith-Duff commission instead of to Sir Charles Davidson. The only legal council assisting Sir Charles was Captain Thompson, who was a good lawyer, but who was after an officer directly under the command of the minister of militia.

Need an Ambulance. Sir Sam Hughes said he was delighted to see that Sir Wilfrid Laurier was able to be about. He would have thought in view of the political troubles he has been passing thru that he would have to be brought from his home to the parliament building in an ambulance. If he was really as strong as he looked, he had better go down to Quebec and get some of his fellow-countrymen to enlist. Sir Wilfrid, he said, had been very eloquent in Quebec in 1896, when he told the French-Canadians to trust him because he was a Catholic and Tupper was a Protestant and at the same time was telling the people of Ontario that he favored "Hands off Manitoba."

Sir Sam Hughes: "As to Captain Thompson, the fact that he wore the King's uniform made him all the more liable to be counsel in the case before the Davidson commission. It would be a good thing, he thought, if some of the opposition members would get themselves into khaki and go to the Davidson commission."

As to the order in council, none was necessary. The officer commanding at Quebec would have been entirely justified in throwing out the condemned ammunition in the St. Lawrence River.

However, it had been sold for \$20, which was the cost price, and not \$24. The ammunition had gone to the McVickers firm and to no one else. All the insinuations to the contrary, notwithstanding.

Fighting Mood. Maj.-General Sir Sam Hughes came down to the house of commons this afternoon in fighting mood and soon crossed swords with Sir Wilfrid Laurier upon the merits of Colonel J. Wesley Allison.

Colonel Allison, he said, had been a friend of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, and this he insisted upon in spite of Sir Wilfrid's denials.

I am not one of those who go back on my friends, he declared vehemently, and added that Colonel Allison had more honor in his little finger than the auditor-general had in his whole body.

He said that he had been broadly intimidated that Colonel Allison was held in higher esteem in this country than Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

The subject in dispute was the sale of cartridges to the Vickers Company, Limited, which by the way, is already under investigation by Sir Charles Davidson. Gen. Hughes said the sale of the condemned ammunition to the Vickers firm for use in testing machine guns had released a large quantity of good English ammunition for use at the front. No commission or any take-off had been paid. Col. Allison was the agent of the Vickers firm, but the purchase price was paid by the Vickers people into a London bank to the credit of the receiver-general of Canada.

The general then added significantly that no defective ammunition would ever be furnished Canadian soldiers as long as he was in the house.

Another case which was the subject of inquiry related to the burning of a factory in which two firemen were killed and several injured. Several persons were indicted last month on similar charges.

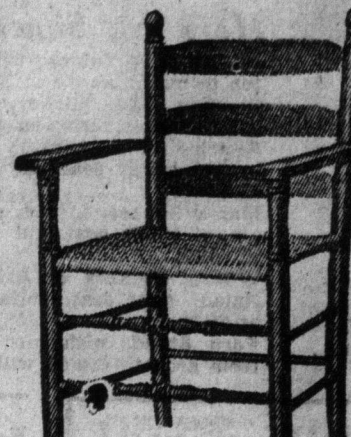
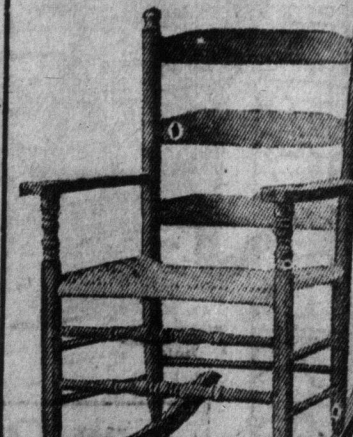
