SUMMER HOTEL BURNED

BELEFAST, Me., Dec. 5.—The Ocean House, a summer hotel at Northport campground, valued at \$10,000, and owned by L. W. Benner, was burned to the ground tonight, starting a conflagration which threatens to destroy all the property in the south shore district. The \$5,000 cottage of Ira Cobe, of Chicago, is in flames, and a score of smaller structures in the path. Should the fire spread to the bay shore, the loss will be \$20,000 or more.
