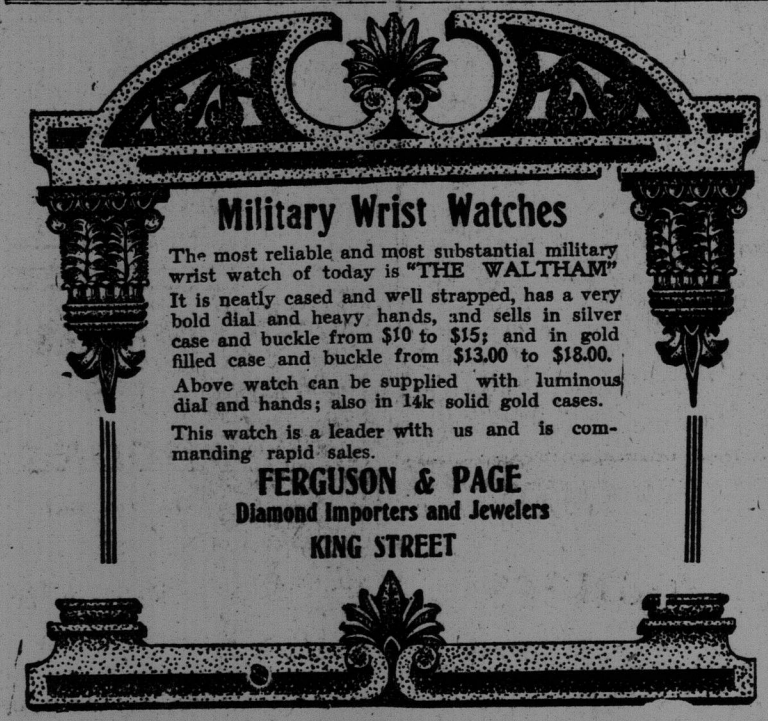

Armande Lavergne, M. P. of Quebec, has written to the minister of militia declining the offer to allow him to recruit a battalion of which he would have command. He says that his principles as a Nationalist are entirely opposed to the participation of Canada in the wars of the Empire, and that he cannot consistently ask others to enlist. In this he says he shares the views of several members of the federal cabinet. As far as he is concerned, as a soldier he will obey orders for service either at home or abroad, but wishes to place the responsibility on the government.

DUKE OF MANCHESTER HAS ASSETS OF BUT \$1000.

London, Nov. 5.—The Duke of Manchester, whose financial difficulties are

now before the court, has lodged a statement with the official receiver in the bankruptcy proceedings showing liabilities in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000, a little more than half of which is fully secured. The duke states that his only

assets consist of jewelry and clothing, valued at \$1,000.
At a meeting of creditors the receiver announced that the duke was now in Paris and would have to undergo an operation next week.
