KING SQUARE NO BEAUTY SPOT DAYS GONE BY

Was Made Dumping Ground For All Kinds of Rubbish

MARKET WAS NEAR COURT HOUSE SITE

"Citizen" of 1840 Rapped Alderman in Letter to Newspaper

A pen-picture of King Square in 1840 is taken from the local office of the Dominion Archives, Princess street, as follows:

"For many years King Square formed a sort of dumping ground for all kinds of rubbish and refuse and its appearance was anything but sightly."

"Near where the Court House now stood a rough wooden building used by butchers and farmers for selling their produce and consequently all sorts of decayed vegetables, meats, etc., were scattered about and became trampled in the mud and mire."

It was not until 1847 that William O. Smith, assisted by some active young men, took charge of affairs and by levelling and cleaning the land and planting trees made a wonderful change in the aspect of the place.

The following letter dated Sept. 15, 1840, from one who signs himself "Citizen" gives a good description of the square as it was at that time:

"Mr. Editor, the Courier being among the watch towers of the city, will you be so kind as to cast your eye on the King Square and pointing to the spot usually occupied as a stand for the market carts—enquire of the authorities whether the fifth and bog mire with which it is overgrown is necessary to the health of the city, or the comfort of those who are called to the market."

"It would seem, from the following notice, that the condition of the Marsh Bridge was as bad, if not worse, than King Square, although measures were taken to improve it."

"Notice to marsh proprietors. The subscribers, having been appointed commissioners of sewers for the City and County of Saint John, and considering the present condition, erecting a sewer across the Marsh Creek, partly in the city and partly in the Parish of Portland, to be in a dangerous state, and necessary to make the necessary repairs thereon, agreeable to the act of assembly in such case made and provided."
