

Carpentier lost no ground in the eyes of ring followers when defeated by Joe Jeannette, the American negro heavy-weight early in 1914. It was to his credit that he twice sent the negro to the mat for counts of nine.

Since that time, his battle with Joe Beckett of England, which he won in a round that in which he knocked out Battling Levinsky in four rounds at Jersey City. N. J., last summer, have been his only contests of importance. The Levinsky fight is the only one in which Americans have seen Carpentier in formal action on this side of the water. It was a fiasco, so far a championship test is concerned.
