MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRE

The King has expressed a desire that on Armistice Day, November 11, there be a complete suspension of all normal activities for two minutes to perpetuate the great deliverance and the memory of those that laid down their lives for it.

By a vote of fifty-five to two, the forty-eight hour week was adopted by the international labor conference in Washington yesterday.

The U. S. railroad administration's central coal committee yesterday ordered discontinued the bunkering of foreign-owned ships in American ports, it being said that existing supplies will just about be able to take care of domestic demands and necessary ocean transportation.

It is reported from Paris that the Treaty of Versailles and peace settlement with Germany will likely become effective on November 28.


SCHOONER IS DRIVEN ASHORE IN THE GALE


