CHRISTMAS WITH OUR SOLDIERS IN THE MOTHERLAND

Good Entertainment in All
The Cities

THOUSANDS IN LONDON

Lavish Hospitality for Overseas
Troops, Including Fine Entertain-
ment in Albert Hall—Stories
Brought from Bonn

London, Dec. 27.—(Canadian Associated Press)—Canadian soldiers spread themselves over England's big cities and towns and into the small hamlets for the holidays. Eight days of leave, with free railway warrants, were freely granted from the various Canadian camps.

London specially was crowded with Canadian soldiers, and there was lavish hospitality provided for the overseas troops. The biggest entertainment was at the Albert Hall, where 2,000 Dominion officers enjoyed a variety of entertainment given by prominent stars of the foot lights. This was followed by a tea, dance and supper, and the whole cost was defrayed by the lady supporters of the Beyond The Sea Association, which has already done so much to make the stay of the overseas officers in London happy.

There was a bountiful Christmas dinner provided at every overseas club in London, and convalescences were provided for subsequently to Albert Hall.

At the Canadian Beaver Hut on the Strand, where many hundreds of Canadian soldiers were lodged, carol singing awoke the sleepers. Santa Claus brought each man a souvenir card.

Many men spent the rest of the day as guests with private families in the outskirts of London, and probably 500 Canadians were thus entertained this Christmas.

There was a big gathering at the Perkins Bull Hospital, Putney.

Canadians returning from the front tell odd stories from the city of Bonn. One is that a little girl asked if they were going to throw the German children into the Rhine, as her father had told her that was what would happen. Our men make friends with the children quickly, but prefer to keep the older inhabitants at a distance. The civilians show respect to our officers.

POPE SPEAKS ON
WAR AND PEACE

Pope's Reply to Greetings from Members of Sacred College

Rome, Dec. 24.—Pope Benedict today received the members of the Sacred College, who presented their Christmas wishes to him. Twenty-three cardinals and many bishops and prelates were present. The Pope expressed a wish that the decisions of the coming congress not would give a new birth to human sentiments which will render communion with our brothers and the sacrifices made for them sweet.

The pontiff declared that he would do all in his power to facilitate acquiescence in the decisions of the congress in order to insure a just and durable peace. Pope Benedict expressed doubt whether the tempest that had devastated the world had not left in the hearts of men the deadly remains of discord, unwholesome germs of discord, vengeance and reprisals. The very array of war and the passion for defense of country, the Pontiff added, it was natural in their origin, although it was natural that in principle they could lead to excess and make the germs of social discord more grave.

The Pope said he wondered if it were not the Holy Father's task to repair the fond ill of the war, no less than the material damages, and dissipate the danger of fresh perturbation which might result from excessive national hatreds and passions. He said he hoped his work henceforth might be the echo of the decision of the peace conference and mainly directed to the care and instruction of his children, and the protection and direction of workers, and the good use of their wealth and authority.

CHRISTMAS TREAT

A large number of visitors were present yesterday afternoon at the Christmas tree and school concert entertainment at the Municipal Home. After inspecting the building the visitors repaired to a class room where addresses were given. The speakers in order were as follows: His Worship Mayor Hayes, Rev. R. Taylor McKim, Protestant chaplain of the home; Rev. A. J. O'Neill, formerly for sixteen years Roman Catholic chaplain of the home, and yesterday representing the present Roman Catholic chaplain, Rev. C. P. Cadden; Rev. J. A. MacKeigan, Rev. H. A. Cody, Rev. Neil MacLaughlin and Rev. Mr. Pinkett. All spoke along the same lines, congratulating the superintendent, the members of the board, and the commissioners on the high state of excellence that the home had attained under their supervision. Among the commissioners who were present were George A. Knodell, A. M. Brown, W. Walsh, W. E. Scully, S. M. Wetmore, James Bryant and William McKeane.

The presentation was made on behalf of the entire congregation of the church in appreciation of the pastor's services. Rev.
