Magnificence of Presidential Inaugurations Likely to be Surpassed at Disarmament Conference—2,000 Expected from Other Lands.

KIDNAP FARMERS AND TAKE WHISKEY

Two Bold Hold-ups Staged in Essex and One Man is Arrested.

Windsor, Ont., Sept. 2.—John Richardson, giving Detroit as his address, was arrested by Walkerville police as one of five armed bandits who staged two hold

ups in Maidstone Township, twenty miles from Windsor, early this morning and took 100 cases of whiskey. Four of the men escaped, but seventy cases of whiskey were recovered in a motor truck abandoned by the bandits. The robbers had a passenger automobile as well as the motor truck. At about 5 a. m. they stopped at the farm of a man named Mullin, smashed through the front door, and ordered Mullin and his son into the yard, where they handcuffed them. They loaded Mullin's whiskey into the cars and drove off

with their two captives. Next they stopped at the farm of a neighbor named Pastillas. They handcuffed him and put him in their car with all his store of liquor. The three men were dropped some five miles from home after their handcuffs had been removed. Neighbors telephoned the Walkerville police, and Jerry Lefebvre, detective, and a constable were sent to the scene. The police met the motor truck on the road and after a short pursuit overtook it. The two men driving it ran off

through a cornfield, and one of them escaped. The other, who the police say was Richardson, was taken back to Walkerville. No trace has been found of the three men in the touring car.

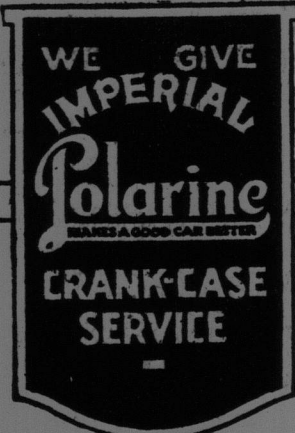
