TELLS OF WORK AS AN ARMY CHAPLAIN

Rev. W. F. McConnell, of
Montreal, Speaks at Fair-
ville Church.

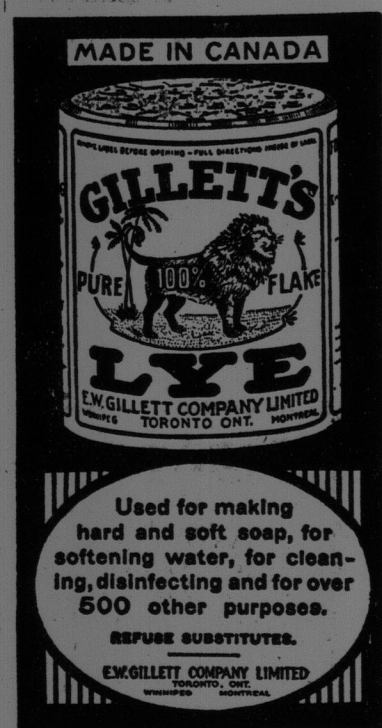
Rev. W. F. McConnell of Montreal was the speaker at the St. Columba Presbyterian church Sunday evening. After the opening exercise Rev. W. M. Townsend, pastor of the church introduced Rev. Mr. McConnell, who read the 40th Chapter of Isaiah, and was listened to with much interest as he told of his experience as chaplain in the Great War of 1914-1918 while at Valenciennes, Salonika, Eppes, etc., and also while he was senior chaplain of the Forestry Corps. He was co-worker at one of the places mentioned with the late Canon Kühring of St. John. He spoke of the regard for religion, which prevailed among the soldiers, and said that when a chaplain was among them during the week as he was, and aiding in their entertainment and recreation, that there never was any difficulty in their responding to the call of worship.

Tribute to Nurses

He paid a tribute to the nurses for their sacrifice and heroism, and a great tribute to the boys who laid down their lives on Flanders Field, that we might have freedom to worship God. Many of these young men had they lived would have taken their place in the world as preachers, doctors, lawyers, etc., and he urged the boys present to prepare to take their places first by being followers of Christ, which would ensure success in any vocation of life. He urged them to bend all their energies to make their lives tell for something, and to face the problems of today with the same spirit our soldiers displayed in the war. He said "There is a great work to be done on these days to establish the Kingdom of Christ on Earth."

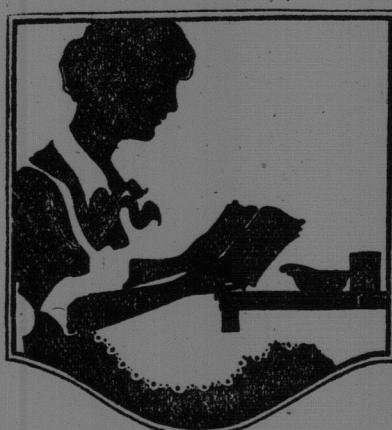

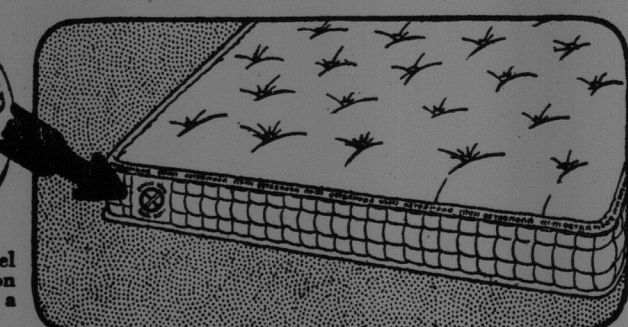
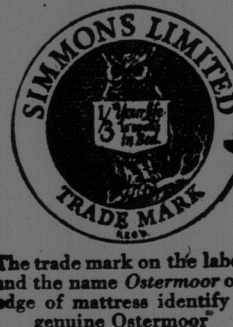
