#### BULGARIA'S SUBSTITUTE FOR MILITARY SERVICE.

Bulgaria has found a better way to serve the state than military service. A law has been recently passed in that country which makes it compulsory upon people to work a certain length of time for the state, just as they formerly had to serve the state in the army. When a man reaches 20 he must serve the state for eight months. When a girl reaches 16 she must serve the state for six months. In addition, all men between 20 and 50 years of age and women between 16 and 30 must give ten days' work every year to the district in which

The men work off their time in building roads, railways, school houses, and the like. Women do the sewing and housework necessary to maintain the hospitals and other public insti-Everybody, from the pre mier to the humblest citizen, is subject to the law.
