Montreal, April 15.—Announcement was made today by Lt. Col. R. H. Webb, D. S. O., M. C., C. M. C., that there will be a reunion of the "Originals" of 1914 in the Windsor Hotel, April 22 to commemorate the second battle of Ypres fought six years ago...

Final arrangements were made at a meeting held last night when Brig. Gen. C. Armstrong, C. M. C., M. C., G. O., acted as chairman, and Colonel Webb was secretary. It was announced that General Sir Arthur Currie, G. C. M. G., C. B., etc., had graciously consented to act as chairman at the dinner...

Summarized the points to remember: (a) All officers who went over with the 1st Battalion, 1914, and who afterwards, during the period of the war, served with a unit in France, or any other battle front, or in the navy or air force with the Canadians or any other British or allied force.

Two Killed, Six Seriously Hurt

Explosion on Steamer, Due to Ignition of Gasoline, Has Fatal Results.

Buenos Aires, April 15.—An explosion on the United States freighter Terra Haute at her dock here yesterday, killed two stevedores. Six men were seriously injured, including three of the crew of the steamer. The men were engaged in unloading the Terra Haute.

The explosion is believed to have been due to the accidental ignition of gasoline. The material damage to the vessel was not serious.
