London, May 5.—Members of the der the threat of breaking off diplosupreme aidied council, shortly after 10 o'ciock this morning, signed an uitimatum to be despatched to Germany, which embodied the definite repartions terms of the Entente, gave details of the guarantees to be exacted and demanded that Germany accept or reject the Allied terms before May 12th.


