ST. JOHN MARKETS
The prices of most things in the local wholesale markets have remained steady and high. Reports as to the outlook for Christmas turkeys are conflicting. On the whole, however, there seems to be an unwarranted feeling among the dealers that turkeys are going to be dearer. At present these birds are selling wholesale at from 17 to 19 cents a pound.

Now that the winter season has come in earnest, British Columbia salmon is again figuring on the market, at from 12 to 15 cents a pound. All kinds of native fresh fish are scarce and high. Owing to the stormy weather the boats have had very little chance to get to the fishing grounds. The following were the wholesale quotations Thursday:
