MONTREAL, Aug. 10.

A DESTRUCTIVE FIRE broke out at 2 o'clock this morning in Henderson's saw mill on the canal bank. The fire lasted about five hours, about \$250,000 worth of property was destroyed, and one life was lost. The fire spread rapidly across the street to the new flour shed, 700 feet long, on St. Joseph basin, which was totally destroyed; thereat the steamers York, late the Huron; a partly completed bridge belonging to the Harpur Commissioners; and an empty barge, the Davis, all being destroyed. Forty piles of lumber also burned.

FIFTY CORPSES.

Over 50 bodies have been recovered from the disaster to the steamer Pat Rogers last week.

Some Americans visiting St. Petersburg have discovered that at sunrise in the summer solstice the sun appears for a moment to rest upon a solitary stone at the eastern head of the avenue of huge upright stones which forms one of the features of that extraordinary place. It is also ascertained that on the setting of the sun in winter a similar phenomenon is seen in the opposite direction. This shows that the axis of the avenue coincides with the sun's rising at the summer solstice, while another line in the range of the stones coincides with the setting sun at the winter solstice. Stonehenge is, therefore, a vast monument of that sun worship which prevailed in early ages among the inhabitants of Britain, as it has prevailed in other parts of the world.
