**LANDERKIN, George, M.D.**, legislator, is the s. of the late Jas. Landerkin, a native of N. S., who settled on the old homestead in West Gwillimburg, Ont., which still belongs to the family, 1824. B. there, 1839, he was ed. at the local schs., and for 17 yrs. worked on the farm. He pursued his med. studies at Victoria Univ., Cobourg (M.D., 1862), obtaining a Provl. license, 1863, since when he has followed the practice of his profession at Hanover and in the surrounding dist. Always a Reformer, he was returned in that interest to the Ho. of Commons for South Grey, g. e. 1872, and assisted in securing the downfall of the Macdonald Govt., 1873. He supported Mr. Mackenzie throughout his Admn., but met with defeat, g. e. 1878. Returned again, g. e. 1882, he sat in opposition under Messrs. Blake and Laurier up to 1896, and was a frequent participant in the important debates of the period. He is known as the "Wit of the House," and it has been said of him that "a whole book might be written of his personal peculiarities and of his signal services to his party. When in opposition he seemed at once to apprehend the ridiculous in the position of the Govt., and his satirical treatment gave keener emphasis to the weakness displayed than would have been obtained by other means." Dr. L. continues the representative of South Grey in the popular chamber at Ottawa, and is now Chairman of the Comte. on Standing Orders. He became Presdt. of the Can. Mutual Mining and Developing Co., 1897. His motto will always be: "Can. first, last and all the time." He is a mem. of the Meth. Ch., and m. 1870, Mary, dau. of Joseph Kirkendall, Elora, Ont.—*Hanover, Ont.*

**LANDRY, Hon. Auguste Charles Philippe Robert, Senator**, is the s. of the late Dr. J. E. Landry, an eminent physician of Quebec, by his

wife, Caroline E. Lelièvre. B. in Quebec, Jan. 15, 1846. He was ed. at the Semy. and at Laval Univ. there (B.A., 1866). He subsequently studied Agricul. Science at the Coll. of Ste. Anne, and devoted himself to farming. When quite a youth, he won the gold medal offered by the Council of Agricul. for the best treatise on agricul., in theory and practice. Later, he became a mem. of the Council. Secy. of the Colonization Soc., Presdt. of the Montmagny Agricul. Soc., and V.-P. of the Union Agricole Nationale of the Province. He was elected Presdt. of the Quebec Exhn. Co., 1894, and Presdt. of the Council of Agricul., *vice* Joly, 1896. Mr. L. served for many yrs. in the V. M., and was promoted Lt.-Col., commanding the 61st Montmagny and L'Islet Batt., Jan. 9, 1885. He holds a 1st class V. B. cert., has been decorated by the Pope with the Order of St. Gregory, and is an hon. A.D.C. to H.E. the Earl of Aberdeen. Politically, a Con., he has held the Presidency of the Con. Assn. of Quebec. He sat for Montmagny in the Quebec Assembly, from g. e. 1875 until Nov., 1876, when he was unseated and disqualified. At the g. e. 1878, he was returned for the same constituency to the Ho. of Commons, of which he continued a mem. up to the g. e. 1887, when he was defeated. He was called to the Senate by the Earl of Derby, Feb. 23, 1892. In religious faith, a R. C., he m. Oct., 1868, Wilhelmina, dau. of the late Etienne Couture, St. Gervais, P.Q.—*"Villa Mastai," Quebec: Quebec Garrison Club.*

**LANDRY, Hon. Pierre Armand**, judge and jurist, is the s. of Armand Landry, who sat formerly in the N. B. Assembly, by his wife, Pelagi Casey. The family came to Acadia with Charnisay 250 yrs. ago, and the name is to be found in the first census, 1670. In 1717 the families of Latour and Landry became united by marriage. B. in Dorchester, N.B., May 1, 1846, he
