An Act to amend the Militia Act.

HER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. Sections 41, 45 and 47 of *The Militia Act*, chapter 41 of R.S.C., c. 41, 5 the Revised Statutes, are repealed and the following are sub-new sections stituted therefor:—

"41. In and for the military districts hereinbefore mentioned Officer there shall be appointed an officer who shall command the commanding Militia in the district or districts for which he is appointed, in district.
