

and every other description of Lumber; to avoid unnecessary delay.

VII. *And be it enacted*, That all holders of measuring tapes, and scribes of timber shall, before entering on their duties as such, take and subscribe before some one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace, the following oath, that is to say:

"I, A. B. do solemnly swear, that I will in all cases, give and mark the true measurement of every description of lumber on which I may be employed as holder of tape or scribe of timber; and that I will act without favour or affection—*So help me God.*" Which oath shall be filed in the office of the Supervisor; *Provided always* that persons so employed, shall in all cases, when practicable, be apprentices or candidates for becoming Cullers and Measurers.

VIII. *and be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of every Culler to check and examine his measurement and counting, and to sign the specification thereof; (such specification to be entered, checked and examined, in the office of the Supervisor, and counter-signed by him or his Deputy,) and to furnish a copy of such bill to the owner of the property within twenty-four hours after the measuring or culling of any lumber is completed, if called for.

IX. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the Supervisor to record the several applications for measuring or culling every description of
