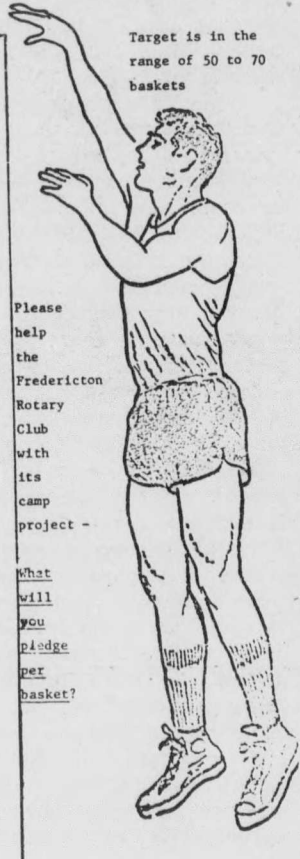

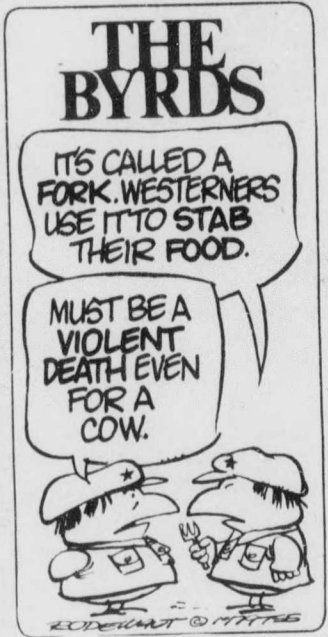

Keystone cops

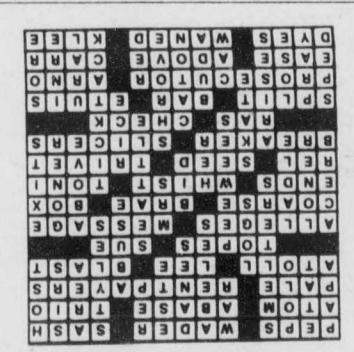
A recent slip-up by the Tulsa police department beats anything in the Keystone Cops.
