The Green Hornets did it. Displaying the form that earned them the Port Credit Ball Hockey League title, Hornets won a pair of playoff final games to achieve a big double.

They downed Golden Jets 2-1 and 3-2, the latter in an extra-time thriller, to take the best-of-three series in consecutive games.

Goals by Kim Wilson and Brian Kilbridge, the loop's top marksman, enabled Hornets to open up a two-goal lead in their first game. Mike Hamlin and Arnie Moore earned assists on the goals.

A desperate comeback effort, which started with Craig Abel's slap shot, fell short of its target, partly because of outstanding goaltending by Mike Pearce and partly because of

stalwart defensive work by Moore and Ken Barnes.

More than 150 fans turned out for the second game of the final and witnessed the finest battle of the season.

Kilbridge opened the scoring on a pass from Dale Murphy but Bob Wilson knocked in Abel's pass to tie it up. Hornets regained their lead on another goal in the third stanza by Kilbridge. With time running out, Jets fought back desperately and Darold Tomkinson connected on passes from Abel and John Lindsay to drill a low shot past Hornets' netminder Pearce and send the game in a sudden death overtime.

The two sides failed to produce a scoring play in first period of extra time, then with five minutes gone in the second frame, Ken

Erindale Stars had two goals from Jorgen Laughritzen to overcome Truscott Indians 2-1. Garth Duckett connected for Indians.

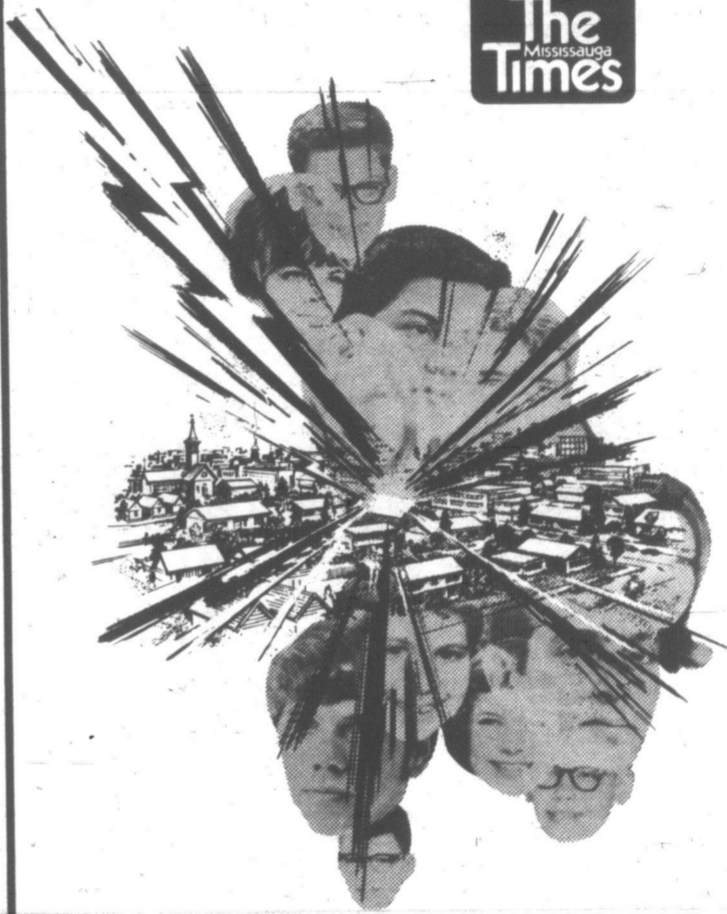
Forest Glen put together two goals by Ray Kelly and singles from Nicky Magic.
