Sir,

I beg to inform you that Mr. Agent Lucas has written to advise me of the desire of Noah son of Cecile and of Amos Peter to be transferred to the Peace Hills Agency.

He states that Noah, hitherto paid with the Stomach at Morley has two children by his first wife (who is dead) whose money is drawn for them by his mother-in-law O-tet-chee-pou-ah-pees - that he is married to a daughter of No 47 of Bobtail's Band - that he claims arrears for himself for 1885 on the ground that he left Morley, shortly before the payments, to hunt, and wintered on the Red Deer River.

Amos Peter said to be a stray from Morley is stated to be married to a daughter of Sharphead's Band, and has been with it all last winter and this summer. I have to request to be informed whether you know of any objection to allowing these transfers to be made.
