



Ottawa, 1st May, 1907.

Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 26th ultimo, I beg to say that the sum of \$38102.10 was voted by Parliament to restore the account of the Mississaugas of the Credit. \$29,161.17 of this amount will be placed to the credit of the band in order thereby to restore to their capital account the amount originally at their credit. The balance, viz:- \$8,940.93, represents the loss of interest money sustained by the band since 1884. It is considered that it would not be in the best interests of the band to make one distribution of this \$8,940.93. The amount in question will therefore be spread over four or five payments with intervals of six months between. A cheque to enable you to make the first distribution will be sent at an early date.
